PASS TYPE

Full Service: Based on the \$142 (\$149 with tax) March Pass Program covers lift tickets for all operating days and any scheduled nights, free inside storage skis/boots, cafeteria discount, occasional guest passes and discount guest passes, laminated photo ID pass for access of Pass Perks Program

The **Special:** Based on the \$99 (\$104 with tax) March Pass program started at Camp 10 Ski Area 8 years ago- Covers lift tickets for all operating days. The photo ID laminated pass is an option add on for \$15 each that enables access to the Pass Perks Program.

Sundays Only: Based on the \$78 (\$82 with tax) March Program provides lift tickets on all operating Sundays...designed for the skier/snowboarder who has very few open Saturdays due to commitments in other sports or activities.

Children age 8 and under, as of Dec 1st, are free when parent or grandparent is purchasing a season pass One free child pass for age 8 and under for each parent/grandparent purchasing a season pass. Early sale purchase payments are not deposited till after July 1st. Season Pass funds are used to capitalize purchase of required insurance policies and are not refundable unless the ski area does not proceed with normal opening.

Waiver: Please read and sign.

Purchasers and users of season passes understand that skiing, snowboarding, walking, or sliding on winter surfaces, driveways, parking lots, ski lodge floors can result in injuries and these are normal risks of participants in winter activities. Skiers/snowboarders must be able to ski or board under control and be aware of man-made and natural fixed objects that could result in collisions and injuries if the skier or snowboarder does not ski or board under control. Skiers/boarders understand that use of ski lifts can result in injury as a result of falls, ski lift malfunctions, or operator error and accepts such risks. It is the parent's responsibility to explain these risks to their children. Wisconsin is an assumed risk state. If you are injured while participating in skiing or snowboarding your involvement was at your own risk.
